A route that we designed as part of the promotion of the famous emerging destinations in Colombia, places that were closed for decades but are now shown to the world as an oasis of biodiversity, wonderful people and incredible landscapes. We will have the opportunity to explore the new natural reserve of the Harpy Eagle, a project that was born in 2022 and that materializes thanks to the help of many of our clients, organizations, and people with the creation of a private protected area for this important species and many other birds, mammals and plants. However, this trip could not end anywhere, we will do it in the beautiful town of San José del Guaviare where thousands of years of history are shown in the incredible murals of cave paintings and in its majestic Amazonian rocky landscapes of the Guyana shield. An unforgettable trip, without a doubt, designed to be a world-class birding route and to position unique and unforgettable destinations.

10 February / Day 1. Arrival to Bogota / Hilton Garden Inn

11 February / Day 2. Transfer to Santa Maria, Santa Maria Forest / Hotel La Esmeralda Santa Maria

The Santa Maria Forests have been preserved for years thanks to the conservation programs of the Chivor Hydroelectric and the lack of accessibility in the area in recent years. These forests are characterized by being immersed in tremendous and beautiful canyons that bathe in crystalline waters and a unique plant diversity. The municipality of Santa Maria and the surrounding municipalities are also famous for being the main place in Colombia for the extraction of emeralds, it is said that the series of 18 have to cross the mountain and which can be visited on the way to Santa Maria, were paid for the thousands of emeralds that were found. The crystalline waterfalls fall into the tunnels, sometimes also full of bats and other animals. This is undoubtedly a beautiful place full of biodiversity and great countries, with magnificent birds and rich cuisine.

12 February / Day 3. Almenara Forest / Hotel La Esmeralda Santa Maria

The Municipality of Santa Maria is strategically located on the eastern slope of the eastern mountain range, from here you can visit Andean, montane and premontane forests that finally in the lower lands becomes the foot of the Colombian plains. The Almenara Natural Reserve is located right on this strip and although its influence is mostly of Andean birds there are many interesting records of lowland birds that visit this place, then becoming a transitional area for many species of birds. Recently in this natural reserve the species Spot-winged parrotlet was registered, of which there was no evidence since 1945 which makes it very important for bird watching. It is very easy to walk and the conditions for bird watching in the place are excellent, in normal situations you can observe birds there all day, this reserve is part of the buffer area of the Chivor hydroelectric.

13 February / Day 4. Cachipay Forest / Hotel La Esmeralda Santa Maria

The Road to Cachipay, is a little traveled place in the middle of a beautiful tropical humid forest where a base of the Colombian army operates which is very good for the observation of birds of the foothills of Llanos, and only 20 minutes from the town of Santa Maria. One of the main attractions of Cachipay is the observation of owls, which come to feed on large moths at nightfall. The Cachipay road is very easy to walk, you can see beautiful landscapes of the Upia and Lengupa River valley. This is a good place to observe some good species of tangaras, woodpeckers and antbirds.

14 February / Day 5. San Luis Road, transfer to Restrepo, Humedales del Silencio / Aitabu Hotel

The El Silencio wetlands are located in the municipality of Cumaral, about 45 minutes from the city of Restrepo. This is a private farm that protects 2 large wetlands with many species of waterfowl and open areas, as well as populations of monkeys, such as Squirrel. Monkey, Zocay Monkey & Brown-faced Capuchine. The area is basically flat land accessed by cattle gatekeepers, very easy to walk, but in an open area so it is important to protect yourself from the sun and insects; It is a very good place for photography of birds, alligators and some species of monkeys.

15 February / Day 6. Monfortiano Trail, / Aitabu Hotel

The Montfortiano Trail is a 100-year-old ancestral path that goes from the municipality of Calera to Villavicencio and Restrepo passing through the Chingaza Paramo, arriving at San Juanito, on a journey that begins at 700 msnm all the way to the highest point at 4.122 m, in the middle of a tropical rainforest. The beginning of the journey starts on a 4x4 vehicle over an access road, offering the possibilities to spot birds in a trajectory of about 1.5 km.

This is a beautiful path filled with bridges, incredible viewpoints and a breathtaking landscape. Although the journey is longer than 22 km, it is possible to spot birds only on one part of the trajectory due to logistics issues. This trail is dedicated to do "trueques" (commercial exchanges) between Muiscas and Guayupes indigenous, by exchanging corn and salt, and it is also known as the path to Meta, which is properly conserved and there are few transits.

16 February / Day 7. Bavaria Forest, transfer to Vista hermosa / La Posada Monte Real

The Bavaria Forests are located in the outskirts of the city of Villavicencio, on the foot of the mount in the Colombian eastern cordillera and facing the ecosystems from the basin of the Orinoco River. The Bavaria Forest constitutes a patch of a humid tropical rainforest, as it is a jungle-like fragment at the transitional foothills between the Andes and the savannas of Colombia. It is precisely this blend of ecosystems that help to create a diversity of birds that is truly particular. The Bavaria Forests are a protected property by the largest brewery in the country and a very especial place for the city of Villavicencio, which serves as a lung to this entire vast region. On top of the Bavaria mountain is located the Halcón Colorado Natural Reserve from Fundación Proaves and from there it is possible to enjoy a breathtaking view across the immensity of the Colombian Llanos. This is truly a very special place and quite possibly the one with the most biodiversity of mountain birds in the department of Meta.

17 February / Day 8. Harpy Eagle Reserve / La Posada Monte Real

The Harpy Eagle Natural Reserve is a private land protected by Manakin Nature Tours, with an area of 110 hectares at the foot of the Serranía de la Macarena Mountain range, in the village of Alto Guapaya in the municipality of Vista Hermosa, in the department of Meta, which was established as a Manakin conservation program to protect a Harpy Eagle nesting area and a very important watershed of the Legia River. The reserve has an extension of 70 hectares of primary forest and 40 hectares of pastures and avocado crops, as well as ample water sources and a high biodiversity of plants and animals. It is possible to see 6-8 species of monkeys among which the Woolly Monkey and the Zocay Monkey stand out, as well as some very good species of birds and other mammals, such as Puma and Jaguar. Work is currently underway to adapt tourism in the reserve, among which are bird feeders, hides and feeders for species of mammals and birds. The nature reserve is a first private conservation initiative through Manakin Tours birdwatching tourism, where dozens of clients, organizations and individuals collaborated to acquire this land. It has an incredible view to photograph the harpy eagle in nesting season, and access is relatively easy compared to other

places where these nests have been reported in the country, it is intended to position this reserve as one of the best for photography of birds and wildlife in Colombia.

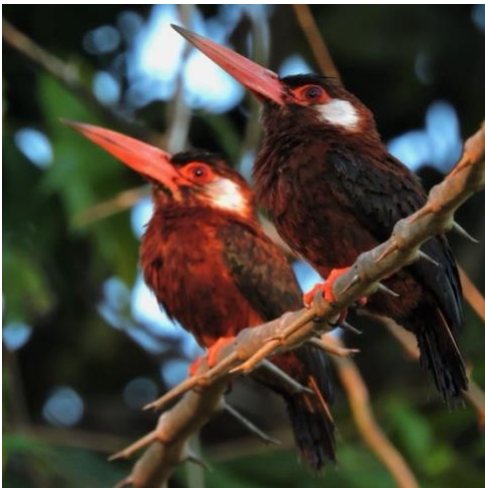
18 February / Day 9. Piñalito, Finca La Corcovada / La Posada Monte Real

La Finca la Corcovada, is an incredible hacienda and an example of incredible private conservation, of approximately 500 hectares on the Guejar River basin, of which 300 hectares are in highly preserved jungle, and the rest in rice crops and cattle, in where its owners have decided to bet on conservation and tourism, leaving the forest preserved in perpetuity and taking advantage of its rich biodiversity with responsible natural tourism; it has 9 species of primates and a list of more than 230 species of birds that grows every day as it is explored. The topography of the reserve is flat, although it has some hills that serve as an ideal setting for canopy bird photography. The farm has a particularly beautiful history, since it is part of the land on which he actively participated in programs to replace illicit crops with other crops, including cocoa and nature conservation. The place is very easily accessible and allows long tours in different ecosystems that include wetlands, savannahs, grasslands and primary tropical rainforest.

19 February / Day 10. Bosque de Maracaibo, transfer to san Jose / San Jose Hotel Quinto Nivel

The Bosques de Maracaibo are a group of relictic Gallery Boques with a high diversity of birds and animals that fall within the buffer zone of the Serranía de la Macarena National Natural Park. These forests are bathed by the Caños Sardinata and Unión, which are in charge of giving an interesting contribution of species of mammals, reptiles and amphibians of the place. This tropical humid forest ecosystem has a good network of trails for easy bird watching and a very entertaining time.

20 February / Day 11. Puerta de la Amazonia – Buenavista / Hotel Quinto Nivel

In the urban area of San José del Guaviare, there is the Puerta de la Amazonia trail which is located 2 kilometers away, in the village of Buena Vista, there the main trail can be traveled on foot or by boat when the river is at its maximum growth point; It is approximately 8 km round trip, with a low level of difficulty, which begins in a stubble area and then enters a flooded forest in a very good state of conservation and with many birds of great interest to tourism. This sector has a record of more than 150 species, of which the Wire-tailed Manakin (*Pipra filicauda*), Long-billed Woodcreeper, (*Nasica longirostris*) and White-eared Jacamar (*Galbacyrhynchus leucotis*) stand out, among other species of much interest. This trail is one of the best to see the Black-spotted Bare-eye, one of the most sought after species in this region.

21 February / Day 12. Villa Marcela & Ciudad de Piedra / Hotel Quinto Nivel

Located in the village of La Pizarra, the forests of the Alps and Villa Marcela, are mainly composed of low vegetation embedded in a series of unique rock formations similar to labyrinths between the rocks that, in addition to being a natural attraction of great interest, houses a series of very interesting bird and animal species. This area is also known as Ciudad de Piedra, which has a network of trails that end in a lookout where you can see the entire savannah of San José del Guaviare and crosses through different types of ecosystems between pastures, secondary forests, and forests. mature which allows a very good observation of birds. This is an area of great ornithological interest since it is one of the points with the best options to see the incredible Guyanese Cock of the Rock, which is one of the most beautiful birds in the entire region and a symbol of tourism in San Jose del Guaviare.

22 February / Day 13. Cerro Azul / Hotel Quinto Nivel

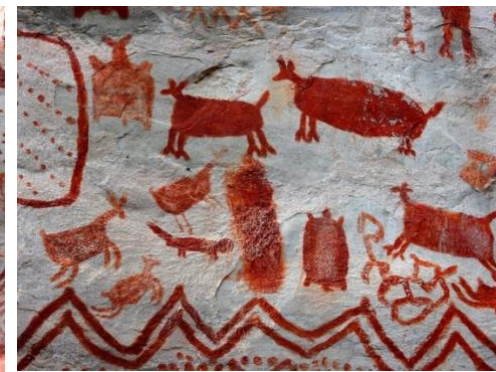
This mystical and ancestral place have cave paintings with more than 12,000 years old that continue to be a mystery for researches and locals. In a journey of approximately 3 km you will be able to see three huge panels, which have a surface of 1,200 meters of cave paintings, where hunting scenes and ancestral rituals are represented, also, a cavern of 200 meters in length will be visited that will take you to a viewpoint from where you will be able to appreciate an immense forest on the one hand and on the other areas intervened and under restoration that invite you to learn about the stories of the locals and their previous and current productive activities. A place with a very good biodiversity and a large number of very interesting birds, such as the Cliff Flycatcher that nests in the murals with the paintings.

23 February / Day 14. Puerta de Orion, flight to Bogota / Hilton Garden Inn

We will start in the morning by driving 25 minutes to La Serranía La Lindosa at the Orion gate area, once in place we will make a walk on the gallery forest and savannas of the Guianan rock shield, while watching birds and maybe monkeys we will reach an imposing stone structure. By mid-morning and continue with our walking through the savannas we will reach a beautiful river that rises in the Lindosa Serranía Range, here the vegetation both outside and inside the water is endemic and only shared with the mountain range of La Macarena (also a Guyana rock shield outcrop in Colombia), both a very special formations of the Guyanese shield.

Tour Code: This is a fairly standard birding or wildlife tour with early morning starts and evening finishes to each day. On some days we may take picnic lunches in order to not waste time during the middle of the day or having to leave site. The weather can be unpredictable with rain and sunshine both likely. At higher altitudes it can be chilly. We have an amazing photo opportunity for many species of hummingbirds and other species coming to feeders, we will also be looking for a good number of species that are very rare and seldom seen, but we will be going to areas that hold these sought-after species.
