

This plan involves a very special birding journey to see endemic and near-endemic birds in the north of Colombia where you can enjoy two of the most important mountain ranges in the country; Perijá and Santa Marta, with the addition of the dry forest of the state of Guajira where many special birds are ready to be spotted and photographed. You can delight from a list of around 300 species in a few days and experience one of the most surprising places to see birds in Colombia while obviously your checklist skyrockets!

May 8 / Day 4. Km 4 and Salamanca National Park, transfer Ciénaga / Cienaguas Hotel Km 4 Path Highway to Barranquilla / Barranquilla

Km 4, situated on the scenic outskirts of Barranquilla, invites you to explore a chill, rural paradise that runs parallel to the majestic Magdalena River. This charming, unpaved road meanders through a diverse landscape of secondary growth, vibrant shrubs, and lush plantations, offering a glimpse into the region's natural splendor. Designated as a crucial water regulation zone, Km 4 is an ecological gem where water reservoirs and local crop fields converge, creating a haven for birdlife. Here, you'll discover a rich tapestry of habitats supporting both aquatic species and those from nearby dry forests. The area's warm, humid climate, characteristic of the Caribbean lowlands, enhances the vibrant birdwatching experience. Whether you're a dedicated bird enthusiast or simply seeking a serene escape, Km 4 promises a delightful journey into the heart of nature's bounty, where every turn reveals new wonders in this avian-rich landscape.

Salamanca National Park / Ciénaga

Welcome to the Island of Salamanca National Park, a breathtaking sanctuary of mangrove forests, serene swamps, and idyllic beaches, all visible from the picturesque road connecting Barranquilla to Santa Marta. This island, designated an Important Bird Area (IBA), is nestled alongside the Ciénaga Grande Fauna & Flora Sanctuary of Santa Marta. In 1998, both were honored as RAMSAR Sites of global importance, and in November 2000, they were recognized as UNESCO Biosphere Reserves. The Island of Salamanca is a captivating cluster of small islands, sculpted by sediment from the Magdalena River delta. These islands are connected by meandering canals, forming a natural barrier that gracefully separates the Ciénaga Grande from the Caribbean Sea. This unique landscape is vital for thousands of migratory birds and is home to remarkable and rare species, including the critically endangered Sapphire-bellied Hummingbird.

May 9- 10 / Day 5 & 6. Pueblos Palafitos, Ciénaga Grande Santa Marta / Cienaguas Hotel and Taroa Hotel

Palafític towns in Ciénaga Grande de Santa Marta

Explore the enchanting towns of Nueva Venecia and Buenavista, nestled within the stunning Ciénaga Grande de Santa Marta. These remarkable communities embody survival, resistance, and resilience, where water, fishing, wetlands, and mangroves sustain the lives of approximately 5,000 residents. The captivating charm of this region, combined with its vibrant social dynamics and rich biodiversity, makes it an extraordinary destination for birdwatching and a deep dive into the local amphibian culture. You'll discover iconic landmarks and hear inspiring life stories from the locals. Immerse yourself in the vibrant cultural heritage, including the captivating rhythms of "son de negros," and learn about pivotal historical events like the Massacre of the Swamp, an event that, while tragic, fueled the development and resilience of its people. This breathtaking area boasts incredible biodiversity, with wetland ecosystems and mangrove forests serving as a haven for an array of bird species. Keep your eyes peeled for the striking Northern Screamer, the colorful Bicolored Conebill, the graceful American Flamingo, and the tiny American Pygmy Kingfisher, along with a remarkable colony of over 50,000 Neotropical Cormorants.

May 11 / Day 7. Flamencos National Park / Taroa Hotel Los Flamencos National Park / Riohacha

Just a scenic 25-minute drive from Riohacha, discover a breathtaking flora and fauna sanctuary dedicated to protecting the vibrant flamingo population that graces its pristine beaches. Encompassed by arid forests and shimmering coastal wetlands, this sanctuary is a designated Important Bird Area (IBA), boasting over 400 bird species, many of which are coastal migrants from the northern continent. Birdwatching here is a breeze spot unique species that are found nowhere else in Colombia. The sanctuary's distinctive environment offers a refreshing respite, with cooling breezes tempering the high temperatures.

May 12 / Day 8. Guajira Dry Forest transfer Minca / Colores de la Sierra La Guajira Dry Forests / Riohacha



Adventure to the northern reaches of Colombia and explore the captivating La Guajira Peninsula, one of the driest regions in the country. Here, the landscape is shaped by its arid climate, where sparse rainfall creates a unique environment dominated by resilient low-growth shrubs and spiny trees. This remarkable ecosystem fosters a distinctive diversity of species that thrive in these exceptional conditions. The dry forests of La Guajira unfold across the lands of the Wayuu, an indigenous community with whom we have built strong and respectful partnerships, granting you access to this extraordinary region. Wander along sandy trails that weave through dense shrubs, sturdy forests, and occasional swamps and creeks that remain dry for most of the year. A land of rugged beauty and rare biodiversity, where every step reveals the wonders of a unique environment!

May 13/ Day 9. La Cabaña Forest and Minca, transfer Santa Marta/ Mountain House Minca / Santa Marta

At the foothills of the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta, the charming village of Minca is a gateway to nature's wonders in the northwestern corner of the region. This village, set at lower elevations, is surrounded by a dry forest ecosystem that blankets the ridges, while just above, the pre-mountain forest merges seamlessly with coffee plantations. This creates a lush, green paradise that serves as a sanctuary for both resident and migratory bird species. Minca is a bustling hub of activity, offering an array of experiences for visitors and birdwatchers alike. Its verdant landscapes are home to rare and elusive species, including the stunning Goldenwinged Sparrow and the striking Black-backed Antshrike, both of which are challenging to spot elsewhere in the country.

During the northern winter months these foothills harbor a good number of North American breeding migrants including Swainson's Thrush, Yellow-throated Vireo, Tennessee, Golden-winged, Cerulean, Blackburnian, and Black-throated Green Warblers, Rose-breasted Grosbeak and Summer Tanager.

May 14 / Day 10. San Lorenzo Ridge / Mountain House San Lorenzo Ridge / Santa Marta

Discover the enchanting Sierra Nevada of Santa Marta, a true haven for bird enthusiasts and nature lovers alike. Nestled in the heart of the neo-tropics, this mountain range is a spectacular blend of isolation and historical evolution, creating a unique natural treasure that's brimming with avian wonders. Rising majestically to over 5,800 meters above sea level, just 40 kilometers from the sparkling Caribbean coastline, it proudly claims the title of the highest coastal mountain range on Earth. The San Lorenzo Ridge, perched on the northern slopes, offers an unparalleled vantage point for spotting the region's rarest

and most elusive bird species. Revered as Colombia's Holy Grail of birdwatching, this pristine locale is a sanctuary for endemic species. Here, you can observe parrots, tanagers, antpittas, tapaculos, hummingbirds, and many more, each showcasing the Sierra Nevada's extraordinary biodiversity. Birdwatching in this mesmerizing landscape is a breeze, with a tranquil, traffic-free road guiding you through its breathtaking views.

May 15 / Day 11. Birding on the road to El Dorado Reserve, Santa Marta Mountains/ Mountain House

Perched majestically on the Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta, the road to El Dorado Natural Reserve is a haven of cloud forests and natural splendor. This unique location creates a magical confluence of species from both environments, enriching every visit with an array of remarkable wildlife.

May 16 / Day 12. Santa Marta Mountains, transfer to Valledupar / Sonesta Valledupar Mountain House Forest Birding Around / Sierra Nevada de Santa Marta

The Serranía del Perijá, extending northward as a majestic arm of the eastern Andes, serves as a vital ecological bridge between Colombia and Venezuela. This isolated mountain range is a treasure trove of biodiversity, fostering a unique evolutionary hotspot where both flora and fauna have flourished in splendid isolation. Here, in the pre-mountain forests, Andean woodlands, and high-altitude páramos above 3,000 meters, a fascinating array of perija species has adapted to these diverse environments. The Serranía del Perijá is renowned for its endemic and unique wildlife, with several species, including the elusive Perijá Tapaculo and the enigmatic Perijá Antpitta, found nowhere else on Earth. The park's páramo ecosystems, with their stark beauty and high elevation, are particularly noteworthy. They cradle a wealth of rare and endemic species, creating a landscape of extraordinary natural wonder. Ongoing research continues to uncover the intricate taxonomic relationships among these species, adding to the park's reputation as a living laboratory of evolutionary science.


