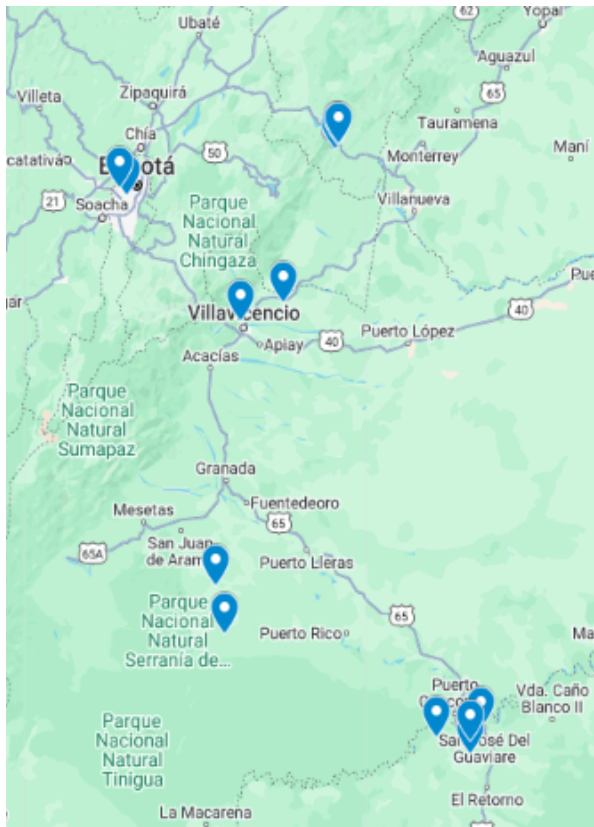




TRANSITION ANDEAN ORINOCO AND AMAZON Southeastern Colombia - The Ultimate in World Class Birding Routes



A new Manakin route to explore the incredible ecosystemic and biological transition that happens from the Andes of the eastern cordillera, the savannahs of Colombian llanos and the transition between the Orinoquia and the Amazon jungle, where we also include the beautiful and very rich ecosystems of the serranía de la macarena, a very biodiverse and special isolated mountainous formation. A route that we designed as part of the promotion of the famous emerging destinations in Colombia, places that were closed for decades but are now shown to the world as an oasis of biodiversity, wonderful people and incredible landscapes. We will have the opportunity to explore the new natural reserve of the Harpy Eagle, a project that was born in 2022 and that materializes thanks to the help of many of our clients, organizations, and people with the creation of a private protected area for this important species and many other birds, mammals and plants. However, this trip could not end anywhere, we will do it in the beautiful town of San José del Guaviare where thousands of years of history are shown in the incredible murals of cave paintings and in its majestic Amazonian rocky landscapes of the Guyana shield. An unforgettable trip, without a doubt, designed to be a world-class birding route and to position unique and unforgettable destinations.

Sept 3: Day 2. Transfer to Santa Maria, Santa Maria Forest / Hotel La Esmeralda

Santa María Forests / Santa Maria

Immerse yourself in the splendor of the Santa Maria Forest, a verdant sanctuary preserved through decades of dedicated conservation efforts by the Hydroelectric of Chivor and its once-remote location. These forests are a hidden gem, cradled within awe-inspiring canyons adorned with crystalline waters and a mesmerizing array of plant life. Santa Maria and its neighboring towns are renowned for their emerald-rich history, with 18 tunnels carved through the mountains a testament to the area's vibrant past. These tunnels, some adorned with cascading crystal-clear waterfalls and bustling with bats and other wildlife, can be explored on route to Santa Maria. The conservation of these forests was funded by the treasures unearthed within, adding a touch of mystique to their beauty. With its breathtaking landscapes, abundant biodiversity, and vibrant birdlife, the Santa Maria Forests offer an unforgettable experience.

Sept 4: Day 3. Almenara Forest / Hotel La Esmeralda Santa Maria La Almenara Natural Reserve / Santa María



Along the eastern slope of the Colombian Andes, the Municipality of Santa Maria offers a stunning journey through diverse ecosystems, from misty Andean forests to lush montane and pre-montane landscapes. As the terrain transitions into the lowlands, it unfolds into the foothills of the Llanos, creating a captivating mosaic of habitats. At the heart of this natural wonderland lies the Almenara Natural Reserve, a unique sanctuary where the Andean and lowland ecosystems converge. This rare blend not only showcases the rich avian diversity of the Andes but also welcomes a plethora of intriguing lowland bird species, making it a vital transition zone for migratory birds. Recently, the reserve made headlines with the rare sighting of the Spot-winged Parrotlet, a species not recorded since 1945, underscoring its significance as a birdwatching hotspot. The Almenara Natural Reserve is a haven for bird enthusiasts, offering easy hiking trails and excellent bird observation conditions. With its prime location as part of the buffer zone for the Chivor Hydroelectric Project, it provides an exceptional opportunity to witness a vibrant array of birdlife throughout the day.

**Sept 5: Day 4. Cachipay Forest / Hotel La Esmeralda Santa María
Cachipay Trail / Santa María**

In the heart of a pristine tropical rainforest, the Cachipay Trail offers a serene escape just 20 minutes from the charming town of Santa María. This lesser-traveled path, safeguarded by a nearby Colombian Army base, is a birdwatcher's paradise at the foothills of the majestic mount plains. As twilight descends, witness the captivating spectacle of owls swooping down to feast on large pullets, an enchanting display of nature's nightly rhythm. The Cachipay Trail is renowned for its ease of hiking and stunning vistas, offering breathtaking views of Valle Del Río Uipa and Lengupa. This lush haven is perfect for spotting an array of vibrant tanagers, elusive woodpeckers, and intriguing antbirds.

Sept 6: Day 5. San Luis Road, transfer to Restrepo, Humedales del Silencio / Hotel del Llano

Humedales El Silencio - Wetland / Cumaral

In the chill municipality of Cumaral, just a 45-minute drive from Restrepo, the El Silencio Wetlands offer a sanctuary of natural beauty and biodiversity. This private reserve is home to two expansive wetlands

teeming with a rich tapestry of waterfowl and open landscapes. As you explore this flat, easy-to-navigate terrain, you'll encounter vibrant populations of monkeys, including the charming Squirrel Monkey, the elusive Zocay Monkey, and the playful Brown-faced Capuchin. The wetlands provide an ideal backdrop for photography, capturing stunning images of birds, majestic alligators, and a variety of monkey species. While the area is accessible and welcoming, remember to protect yourself from the sun and insects as you venture through this captivating landscape.

Sept 7. Day 6. Bavaria Forest / Hotel del Llano

Bavaria Forests / Villavicencio

On the edge of Villavicencio, where the Colombian eastern cordillera meets the lush Orinoco basin, the Bavaria Forests offer a magical escape into nature. Nestled at the foothills of the Andes, this verdant paradise is a captivating blend of humid tropical rainforest and transitional jungle, where the grandeur of the mountains meets the expansive savannas of Colombia. A verdant jewel protected by the country's largest brewery, the Bavaria Forests serve as a vital green lung for the region, teeming with an extraordinary diversity of avian life. Here, in this lush haven, you'll find a unique tapestry of bird species that thrive in this exceptional blend of ecosystems. At the summit of Bavaria Mountain lies the Halcón Colorado Natural Reserve, managed by the esteemed Proaves ONG. From this vantage point, you can marvel at sweeping, panoramic views of the Colombian Llanos, where the vast expanse of the landscape stretches before you. The Bavaria Forests stand out as a remarkable sanctuary, boasting possibly the highest biodiversity of mountain birds in the Meta department.

Sept 8. Day 7. Zocay Ecolodge, transfer Vistahermosa / Night: Posada Monte Real

Acacias Feeders (Zocay Ecolodge) / Meta

Located in the Patio Bonito village in Acacías, Meta, just one hour from Villavicencio, Zocay Ecolodge offers a unique experience for nature lovers and birdwatchers. At an altitude of 500 meters above sea level, its strategic location in the Llanero savanna provides the opportunity to discover bird species rarely seen in other regions of the country, along with a rich diversity of mammals and reptiles. Immerse yourself in the region's biodiversity through its specialized trails: Morichal Trail: Observe aquatic species like herons and kingfishers, as well as howler monkeys in their natural habitat. Llanero Savanna Trail: Explore the savanna and spot the burrowing owl, the horned screamer (*Anhima cornuta*), night monkeys, and the anteater.

Sept 9. Day 8. Transfer Alto Guapaya - Harpy Eagle Reserve / Night: Raptors Glampings

Early in the morning, you will be transferred from Vistahermosa to Alto Guapaya. Upon arrival, you will have breakfast prepared by a local family and then begin the hike toward the Harpy Eagle Reserve.

The trail is approximately 3.3 km long, with only two short sections featuring a 45-degree incline of about 200 meters each. The rest of the trail is mostly flat and winds through the forest, where you may observe various bird species and monkeys along the way. The hike can take between 2 and 3 hours, depending on the participant's physical condition.

Upon arrival at the reserve, you will enjoy lunch and then continue with bird and wildlife observation activities

Sept 10. Day 9. Harpy Eagle Reserve / Night: Raptors Glampigs

Harpy Eagle Natural Reserve / Meta

The Harpy Eagle Nature Reserve is a private land with an extension of 250 hectares at the foot of the Serranía de la Macarena, in the Alto Guapaya district of the municipality of Vista Hermosa, in the department of Meta, Colombia. It was established as a conservation program of Manakin Nature Tours to protect a nesting area of the harpy eagle and the biodiverse ecosystems it inhabits. The reserve has an extension of 200 hectares of primary forest and 50 hectares of pastures in natural restoration, as well as ample water sources and a high biodiversity of plants and animals. It is possible to observe 7 species of monkeys, among which the woolly monkey and the Ornate titi monkey stand out, as well as some very good species of birds (more than 250 species) and other mammals, such as the puma and the Ocelot. It has an incredible view to photograph the harpy eagle in nesting season, and access is relatively easy compared to other places where these nests have been reported in the country. It is intended to position this reserve as one of the best for bird and wildlife photography in Colombia.

This reserve is more than a geographic space; it is a living initiative focused on preserving biodiversity, protecting ecosystems, and empowering local communities. It functions as a vital habitat for endangered species, a research site for promoting science, and a space for environmental education and responsible ecotourism.

Sept 12. Day 11. Playa guio and Laguna negra / Hotel Quinto Nivel

Playa Guio and Laguna Negra

Located 13 kilometers from the urban center of San José del Guaviare, Playa Guio is a forested area along the banks of Caño Negro. This site offers excellent birdwatching opportunities, with species such as the Hoatzin, Long-billed Woodcreeper, Cream-colored Woodpecker, White-eared Jacamar, and Bare-necked Fruitcrow, as well as a wide variety of herons, kingfishers, jacamars, and woodpeckers, among others. From this point, it's also possible to navigate along Caño Negro, venturing deep into the forest until reaching Laguna Negra—an area where more bird species, primates, and turtles can be observed.

La Esperanza Farmhouse

It is a fantastic birding location set within a rich and diverse lowland forest environment. The site offers excellent opportunities to observe a wide variety of Neotropical species, and its well-preserved habitat makes it especially rewarding for both birders and photographers. One of the highlights of this location is the opportunity to observe the spectacular Guianan Cock-of-the-rock.

Happy life feeders, Highlighted as the first bird feeders at the gateway to the Amazon, in a varzea (floodplain forest) ecosystem on the Guaviare River, you can enjoy an experience where you can easily photograph some of these birds, such as the Scarlet-crowned Barbet-Capito aurivirens, Galbalcyrhynchus leucotis, Myrmoborus leucophrys, Monasa nigrifrons, and Bucco macrodactylus. Sept 14: Day 13. Raudal del Guayabero / Hotel Quinto Nivel
Raudal del Río Guayabero/ San Jose del Guaviare

Located 35 km from San José del Guaviare is the community of Raudal del Río Guayabero, in the area known as Angosturas II. From there, we'll begin a journey in a community canoe, navigating between impressive Precambrian canyons along the Guayabero River canyon, with the possibility of spotting wildlife such as birds, turtles, and occasionally, the Amazon pink dolphins. We disembark at Puerto Lucas to begin a walk through an open area, where it is possible to observe toucans, hummingbirds, tanagers, among other species. The journey then continues through a stretch of forest, home to birds such as manakins, antbirds, and woodcreepers, among other species.

Sept 15: Day 14. Puerta de Orion, flight to Bogota / Hilton Garden Inn

Puerta de Orión

Begin your day with a scenic 25-minute drive to the majestic Orion Gate area of La Serrania La Lindosa. Upon arrival, embark on a captivating walk through the enchanting gallery forests and expansive savannas of the Guianan Rock Shield. As you explore, keep an eye out for vibrant bird species and elusive monkeys, and be prepared to encounter an awe-inspiring stone structure that rises dramatically from the landscape. By mid-morning, continue your adventure through the savannas until you reach a stunning river, originating from the Lindosa Serrania range. This pristine waterway, along with its unique vegetation, is endemic and shared only with the La Macarena mountain range—a notable outcrop of the Guyana Rock Shield in Colombia.
