


TRANSITION ANDEAN ORINOCO AND AMAZON Southeastern Colombia - The Ultimate in World Class Birding Routes

We will have the opportunity to explore the new natural reserve of the Harpy Eagle, a project that was born in 2022 and that materializes thanks to the help of many of our clients, organizations, and people with the creation of a private protected area for this important species and many other birds, mammals and plants. However, this trip could not end anywhere, we will do it in the beautiful town of San José del Guaviare where thousands of years of history are shown in the incredible murals of cave paintings and in its majestic Amazonian rocky landscapes of the Guyana shield. An unforgettable trip, without a doubt, designed to be a world-class birding route and to position unique and

unforgettable destinations.

Santa María Forests / Santa Maria

Immerse yourself in the splendor of the Santa Maria Forests, a verdant sanctuary preserved through decades of dedicated conservation efforts by the Hydroelectric of Chivor and its once-remote location. These forests are a hidden gem, cradled within awe-inspiring canyons adorned with crystalline waters and a mesmerizing array of plant life. Santa Maria and its neighboring towns are renowned for their emerald-rich history, with 18 tunnels carved through the mountains a testament to the area's vibrant past. These tunnels, some adorned with cascading crystal-clear waterfalls and bustling with bats and other wildlife, can be explored on route to Santa Maria. The conservation of these forests was funded by the treasures unearthed within, adding a touch of mystique to their beauty. With its breathtaking landscapes, abundant biodiversity, and vibrant birdlife, the Santa Maria Forests offer an unforgettable experience.

February 12: Day 3. Almenara Forest / Hotel La Esmeralda Santa Maria La Almenara Natural Reserve / Santa María




Along the eastern slope of the Colombian Andes, the Municipality of Santa Maria offers a stunning journey through diverse ecosystems, from misty Andean forests to lush montane and pre-montane landscapes. As the terrain transitions into the lowlands, it unfolds into the foothills of the Llanos, creating a captivating mosaic of habitats. At the heart of this natural wonderland lies the Almenara Natural Reserve, a unique sanctuary where the Andean and lowland ecosystems converge. This rare blend not only showcases the rich avian diversity of the Andes but also welcomes a plethora of intriguing lowland bird species, making it a vital transition zone for migratory birds. Recently, the reserve made headlines with the rare sighting of the Spot-winged Parrotlet, a species not recorded since 1945, underscorina significance its as birdwatching hotspot. The Almenara Natural Reserve is a haven for bird enthusiasts, offering easy hiking trails and excellent bird observation conditions. With its prime location as part of the buffer zone for the Chivor Hydroelectric Project, it provides an exceptional opportunity to witness a vibrant array of birdlife throughout the day.

February 13: Day 4. Cachipay Forest / Hotel La Esmeralda Santa Maria Cachipay Trail / Santa María

This lesser-traveled path, safeguarded by a nearby Colombian Army base, is a birdwatcher's paradise at the foothills of the majestic mount plains. As twilight descends, witness the captivating spectacle of owls swooping down to feast on large pullets, an enchanting display of nature's nightly rhythm. The Cachipay Trail is renowned for its ease of hiking and stunning vistas, offering breathtaking views of Valle Del Río Uipa and Lengupa. This lush haven is perfect for spotting an array of vibrant tanagers, elusive woodpeckers, and intriguing antbirds.

Humedales El Silencio - Wetland / Cumaral

In the chill municipality of Cumaral, just a 45-minute drive from Restrepo, the El Silencio Wetlands offer a sanctuary of natural beauty and biodiversity. This private reserve is home to two expansive wetlands teeming with a rich tapestry of waterfowl and open landscapes. As you explore this flat, easy-to-navigate terrain, you'll encounter vibrant populations of monkeys, including the charming Squirrel Monkey, the elusive Zocay Monkey, and the playful Brown-faced Capuchin. The wetlands provide an ideal backdrop for

photography, capturing stunning images of birds, majestic alligators, and a variety of monkey species. While the area is accessible and welcoming, remember to protect yourself from the sun and insects as you venture through this captivating landscape.

February 15: Day 6. Bavaria Forest, transfer to Vista Hermosa / Posada Monte Real Bavaria Forests / Villavicencio

On the edge of Villavicencio, where the Colombian eastern cordillera meets the lush Orinoco basin, the Bavaria Forests offer a magical escape into nature. Nestled at the foothills of the Andes, this verdant paradise is a captivating blend of humid tropical rainforest and transitional jungle, where the grandeur of the mountains meets the expansive savannas of Colombia. A verdant jewel protected by the country's largest brewery, the Bavaria Forests serve as a vital green lung for the region, teeming with an extraordinary diversity of avian life. Here, in this lush haven, you'll find a unique tapestry of bird species that thrive in this exceptional blend of ecosystems. At the summit of Bavaria Mountain lies the Halcón Colorado Natural Reserve, managed by the esteemed Proaves ONG. From this vantage point, you can marvel at sweeping, panoramic views of the Colombian Llanos, where the vast expanse of the landscape stretches before you. The Bavaria Forests stand out as a remarkable sanctuary, boasting possibly the highest biodiversity of mountain birds in the Meta department.

February 16, 17: Day 7 & 8. Harpy Eagle Reserve / Raptor Glamping Harpy Eagle Natural Reserve



The Harpy Eagle Natural Reserve, a pristine 150-hectares sanctuary nestled at the base of the breathtaking Serranía de la Macarena mountain range. Situated in the charming village of Alto Guapaya, Vista Hermosa, Meta, this exclusive reserve is proudly managed by Manakin Nature Tours as part of their dedicated conservation program. Designed to protect the vital nesting grounds of the majestic Harpy Eagle and safeguard the critical watershed of the Legia River, the reserve boasts 80 hectares of lush primary forest alongside 70 hectares of vibrant pastures and avocado plantations. This diverse landscape is home to a remarkable array of flora and fauna. Visitors can marvel at 6-8 species of monkeys, including the Woolly Monkey and the elusive Zocay Monkey, while spotting rare birds and elusive mammals such as the Puma and Jaguar. Our ongoing enhancements include bird feeders, hides, and feeding stations to enrich the wildlife experience. As the premier private conservation initiative supported by Manakin Nature Tours' birdwatching community, the reserve offers unparalleled opportunities for wildlife photography,

particularly of the Harpy Eagle during nesting season. With relatively easy access compared to other locations in Colombia, it aims to become a top destination for capturing the beauty of birds and wildlife.

February 19: Day 10. Finca La Corcovada, Transfer San José del Guaviare / Hotel Quinto Nivel.

Piñalito, La Corcovada Farmhouse

La Finca la Corcovada, is an incredible hacienda and an example of incredible private conservation, of approximately 500 hectares on the Guejar River basin, of which 300 hectares are in highly preserved jungle, and the rest in rice crops and cattle, in where its owners have decided to bet on conservation and tourism, leaving the forest preserved in perpetuity and taking advantage of its rich biodiversity with responsible natural tourism; it has 9 species of primates and a list of more than 230 species of birds that grows every day as it is explored. The topography of the reserve is flat, although it has some hills that serve as an ideal setting for canopy bird photography. The farm has a particularly beautiful history, since it is part of the land on which he actively participated in programs to replace illicit crops with other crops, including cocoa and nature conservation. The place is very easily accessible and allows long tours in different ecosystems that include wetlands, savannahs, grasslands and primary tropical rainforest.

February 20. Day 11. Puerta de la Amazonia Buenavista / Hotel Quinto Nivel Puerta de la Amazonia — Buenavista

Just 2 kilometers from the urban heart of San José del Guaviare, the Puerta de la Amazonia Trail in the picturesque village of Buena Vista beckons adventurers. This enchanting trail offers a versatile journey, accessible by foot or by boat during the river's peak flood season. Spanning approximately 8 kilometers round trip, this easy-to-moderate trail begins in a charming stubble area before leading you into a pristine flooded forest brimming with avian delights. The trail boasts an impressive record of over 150 bird species, making it a prime destination for birdwatching enthusiasts. Highlights include the vibrant Wire-tailed Manakin (*Pipra filicauda*), the elusive Long-billed Woodcreeper (*Nasica longirostris*), and the striking White-eared Jacamar (*Galbacyrhynchus leucotis*). Notably, this trail is renowned for its exceptional opportunities to spot the coveted Black-spotted Bare-eye, one of the region's most sought-after bird species.

This captivating region, also known as Ciudad de Piedra, is not only a striking natural attraction but also a

haven for a diverse array of bird and animal species. Discover an extensive network of trails that lead to a stunning lookout point, providing panoramic views of the vast San José del Guaviare savannah. As you traverse through varying ecosystems—from open pastures and secondary forests to mature woodlands—experience exceptional birdwatching opportunities. This area is a premier ornithological hotspot, renowned for its chances to spot the magnificent Guyanan Cock-of-the-Rock, one of the most striking birds in the region and a symbol of San José del Guaviare's natural splendor.

Begin your day with an early morning departure to Cerro Azul, a scenic 1.5-hour drive from the city, leading you to the awe-inspiring La Lindosa Serrania. As you traverse the gravel road, enjoy the opportunity for effortless birdwatching along the way. Upon arrival, you'll be greeted by our knowledgeable local guide and embark on a captivating 5.2 km walk through the lush jungle, home to the extraordinary natural canvases of Cerro Azul. Here, you'll encounter the most spectacular and well-preserved panels of rock art in the Lindosa Serrania. These ancient murals, some dating back 12,000 to 10,000 years, offer a mesmerizing glimpse into the stories, rituals, and myths of our ancestors through intricate pictograms, zoomorphic, and anthropomorphic figures. With over 250 bird species and at least 3 different monkey species recorded in the area, the wildlife sightings promise to be as enchanting as the rock art. After an inspiring morning, we'll enjoy a delightful lunch at a local farm before returning to the city, carrying with us unforgettable memories of this remarkable journey through Colombia's cultural and natural heritage.

February 23: Day 14. Puerta de Orion, flight to Bogota / Hilton Garden Inn Puerta de Orión y Río de Colores

Begin your day with a scenic 25-minute drive to the majestic Orion Gate area of La Serrania La Lindosa. Upon arrival, embark on a captivating walk through the enchanting gallery forests and expansive savannas of the Guianan Rock Shield. As you explore, keep an eye out for vibrant bird species and elusive monkeys, and be prepared to encounter an awe-inspiring stone structure that rises dramatically from the landscape. By mid-morning, continue your adventure through the savannas until you reach a stunning river, originating from the Lindosa Serrania range. This pristine waterway, along with its unique vegetation, is endemic and shared only with the La Macarena mountain range—a notable outcrop of the Guyanan Rock Shield in Colombia.
